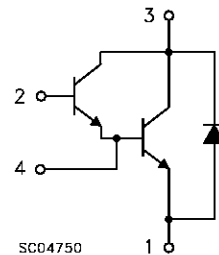

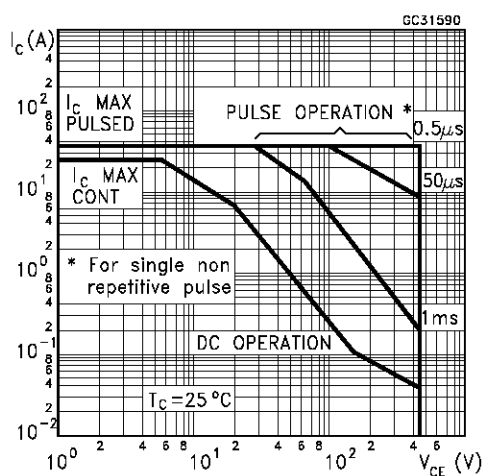

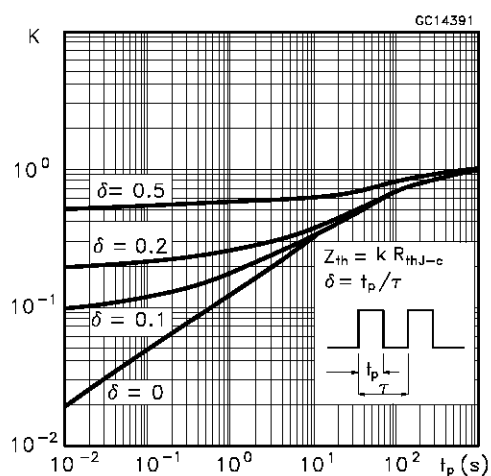
To evaluate the conduction losses of the diode use the following equations:

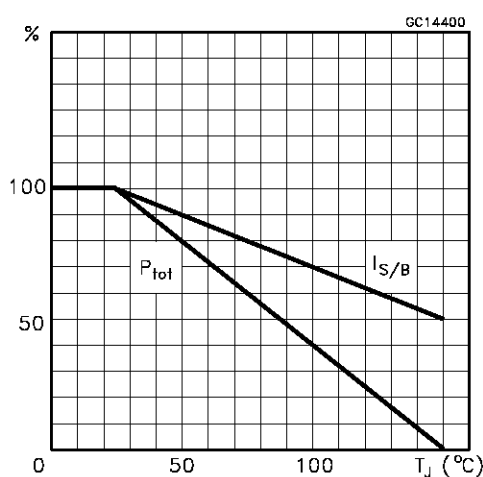
Safe Operating Areas



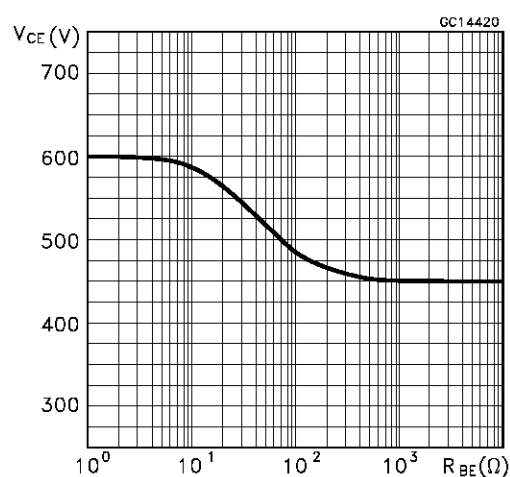
Thermal Impedance



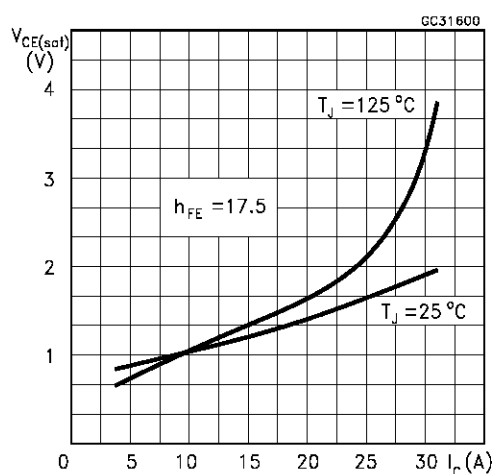
Derating Curve



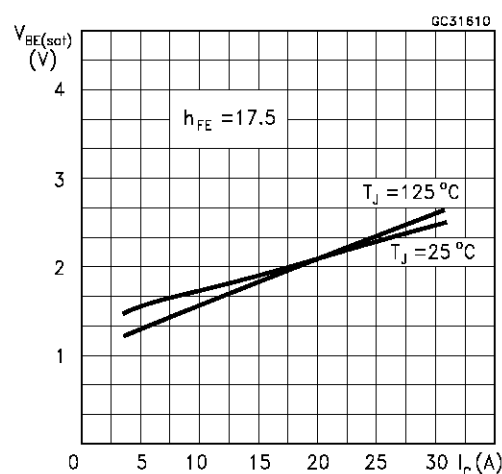
Collector-emitter Voltage Versus base-emitter Resistance



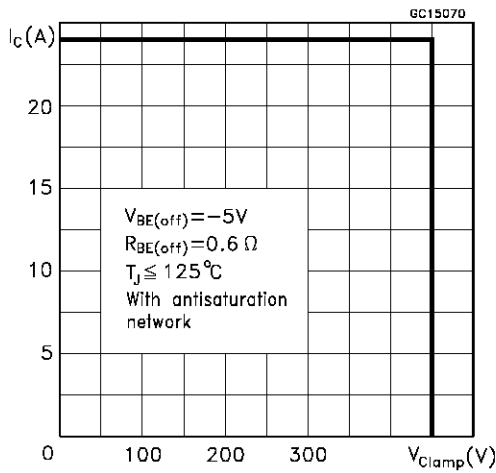
Collector Emitter Saturation Voltage



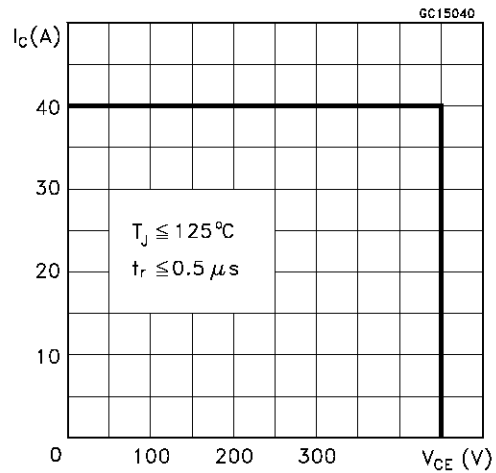
Base-Emitter Saturation Voltage



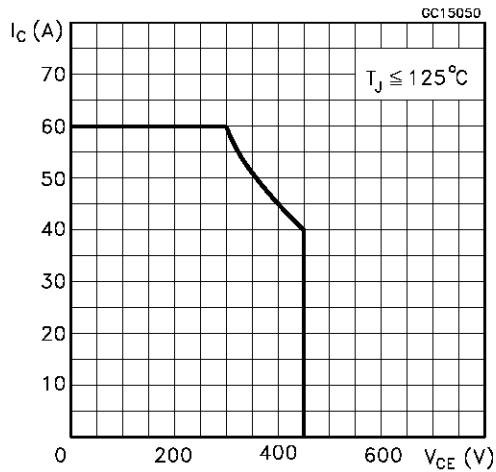
Reverse Biased SOA



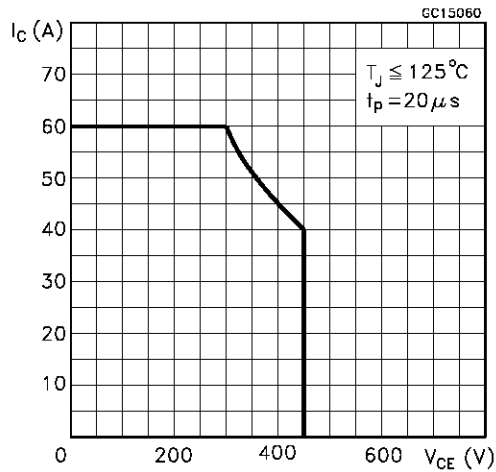
Foward Biased SOA



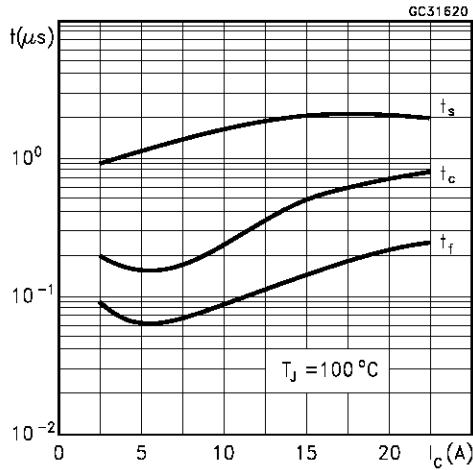
Reverse Biased AOA



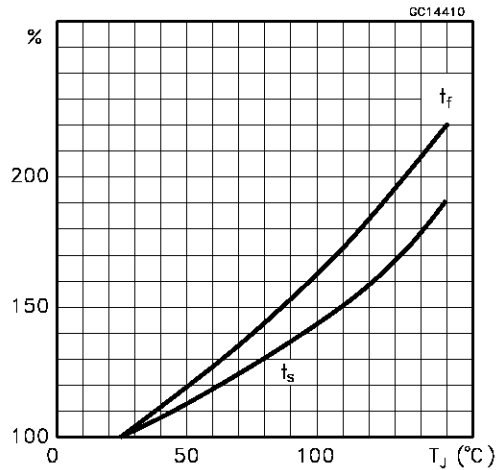
Forward Biased AOA



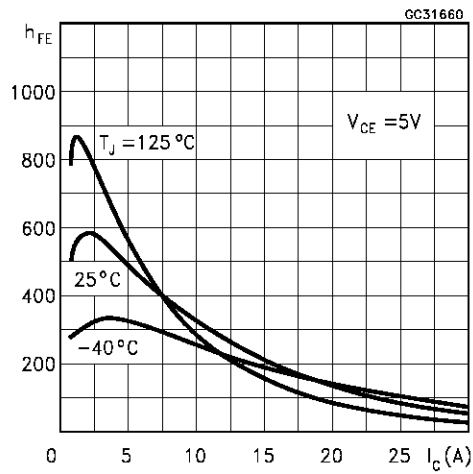
Switching Times Inductive Load



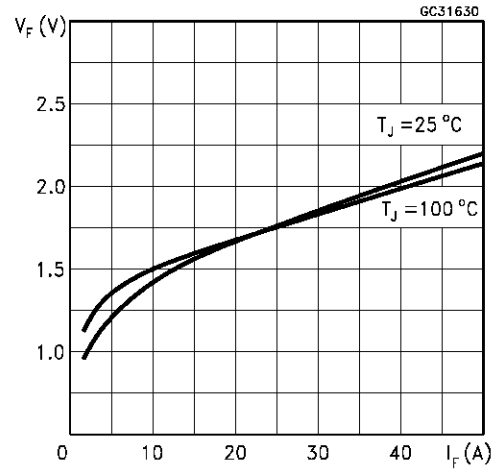
Switching Times Inductive Load Versus Temperature



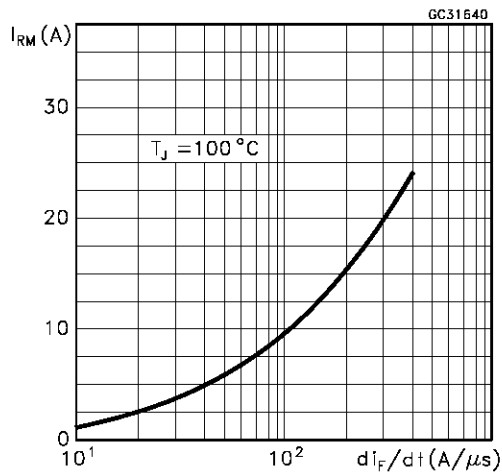
Dc Current Gain



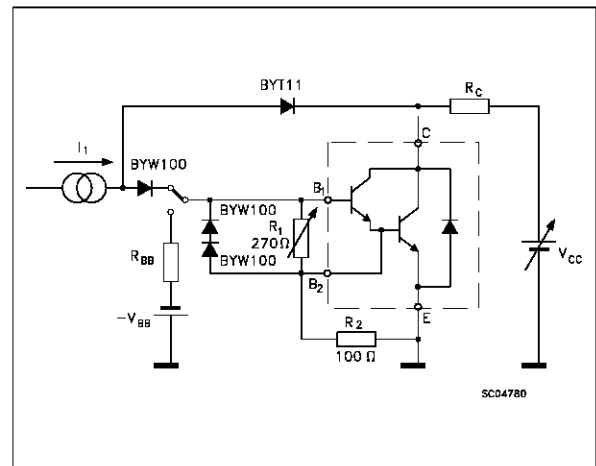
Typical V_F Versus I_F



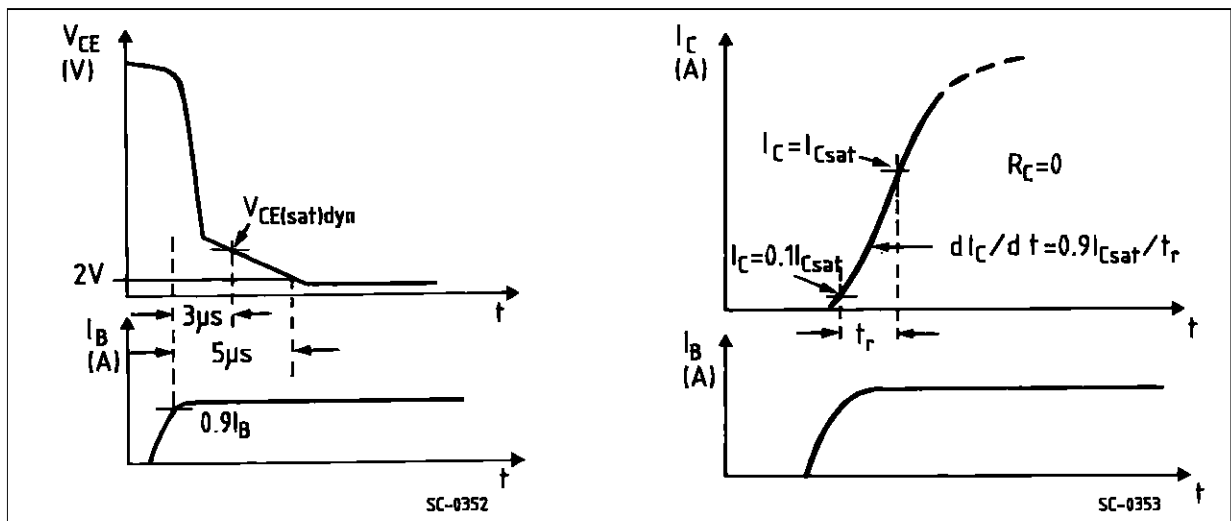
Peak Reverse Current Versus di_F/dt



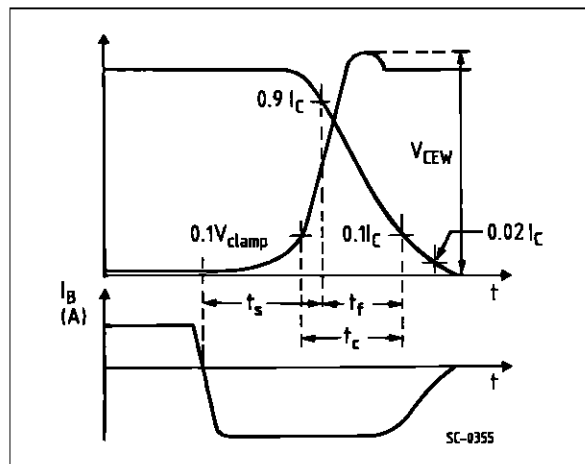
Turn-on Switching Test Circuit



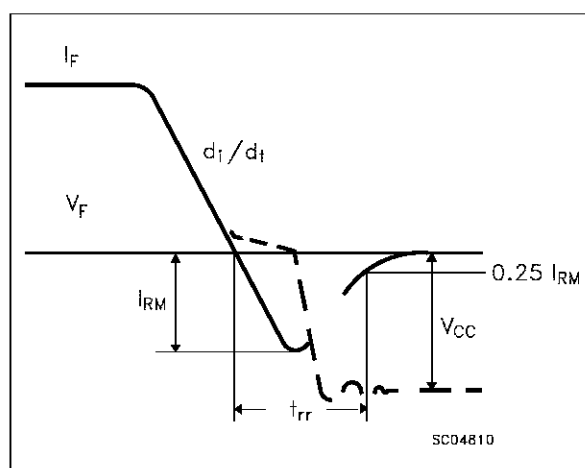
Turn-on Switching Waveforms



Turn-off Switching Waveforms

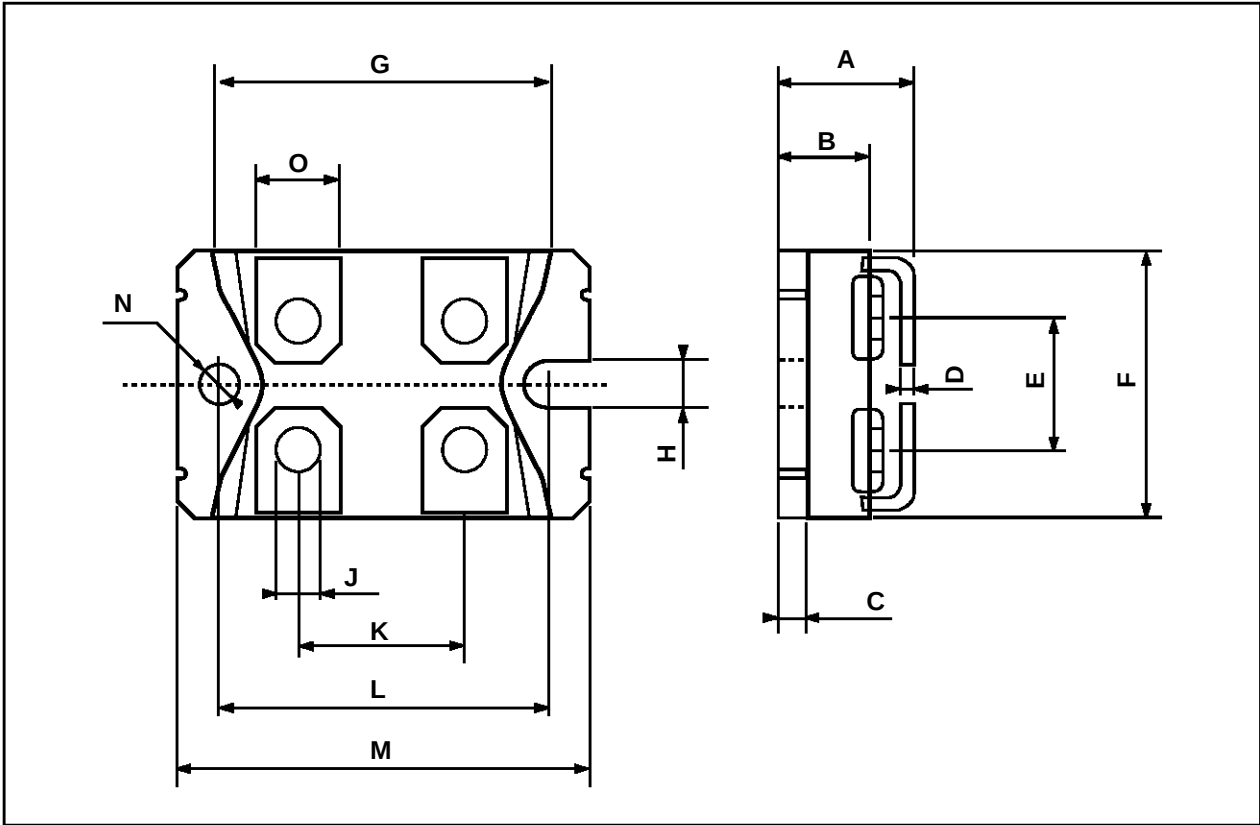


Turn-off Switching Waveform of Diode
