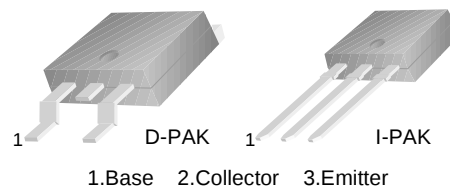

D-PAK for Surface Mount Applications

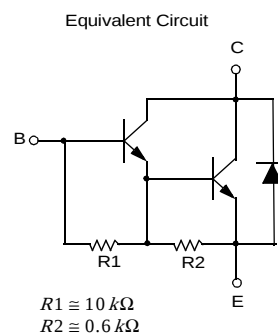
- High DC Current Gain

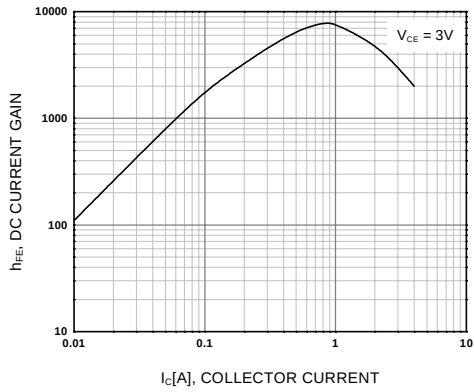


Figure 1. DC current Gain

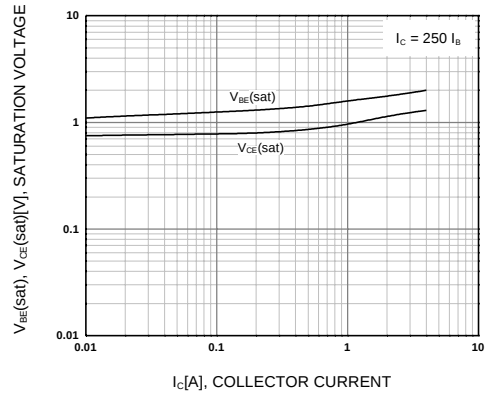


Figure 2. Base-Emitter Saturation Voltage
Collector-Emitter Saturation Voltage

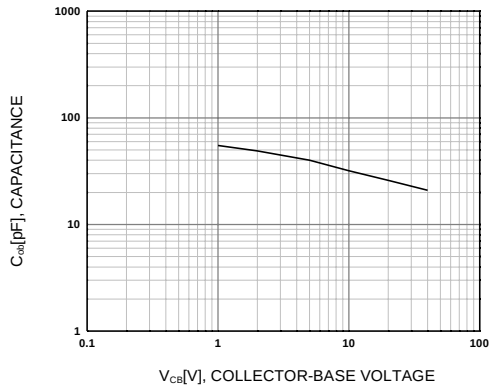


Figure 3. Collector Output Capacitance

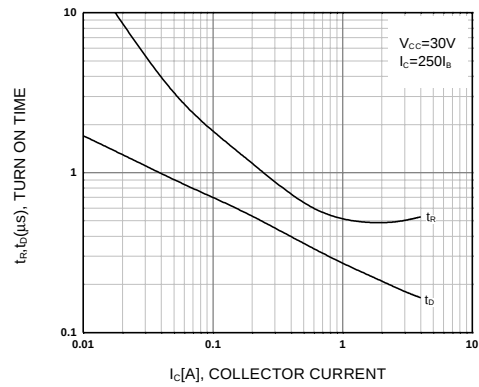


Figure 4. Turn On Time

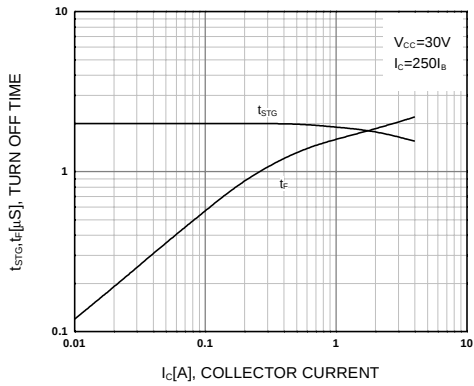


Figure 5. Turn Off Time

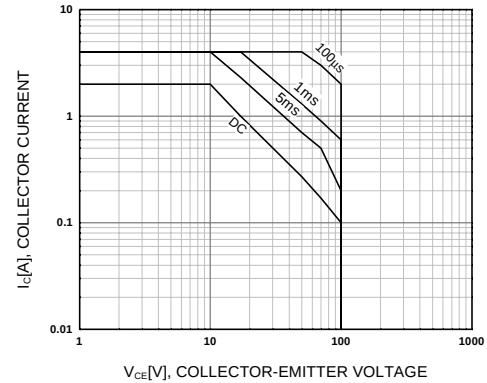


Figure 6. Safe Operating Area

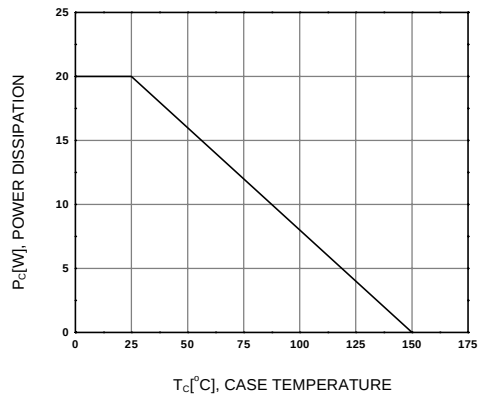
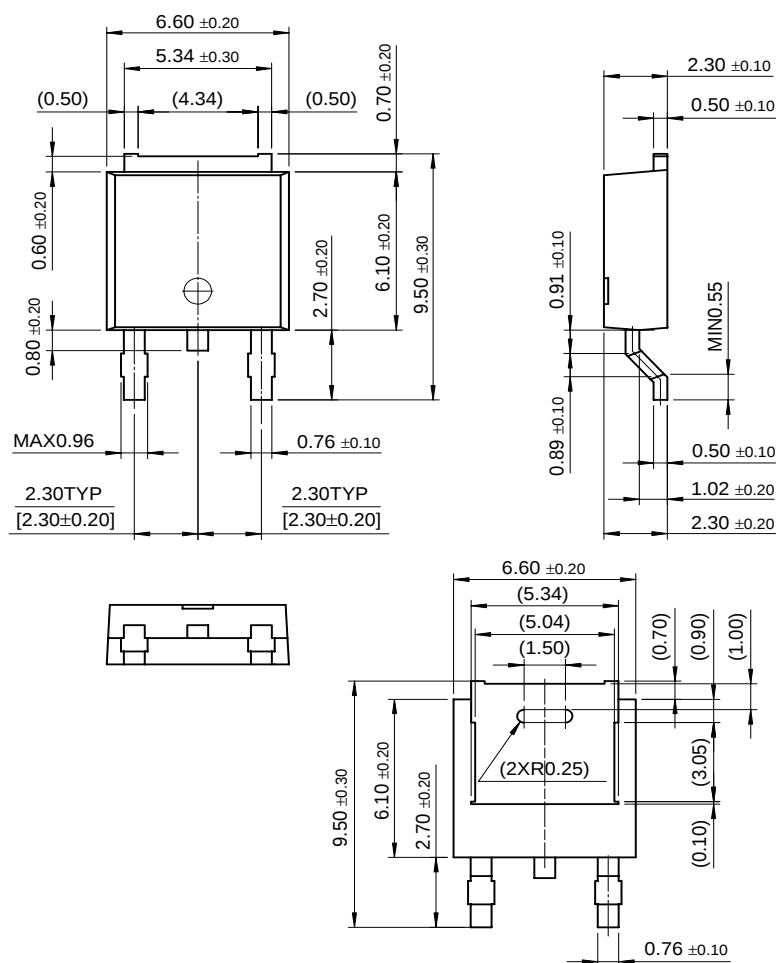


Figure 7. Power Derating

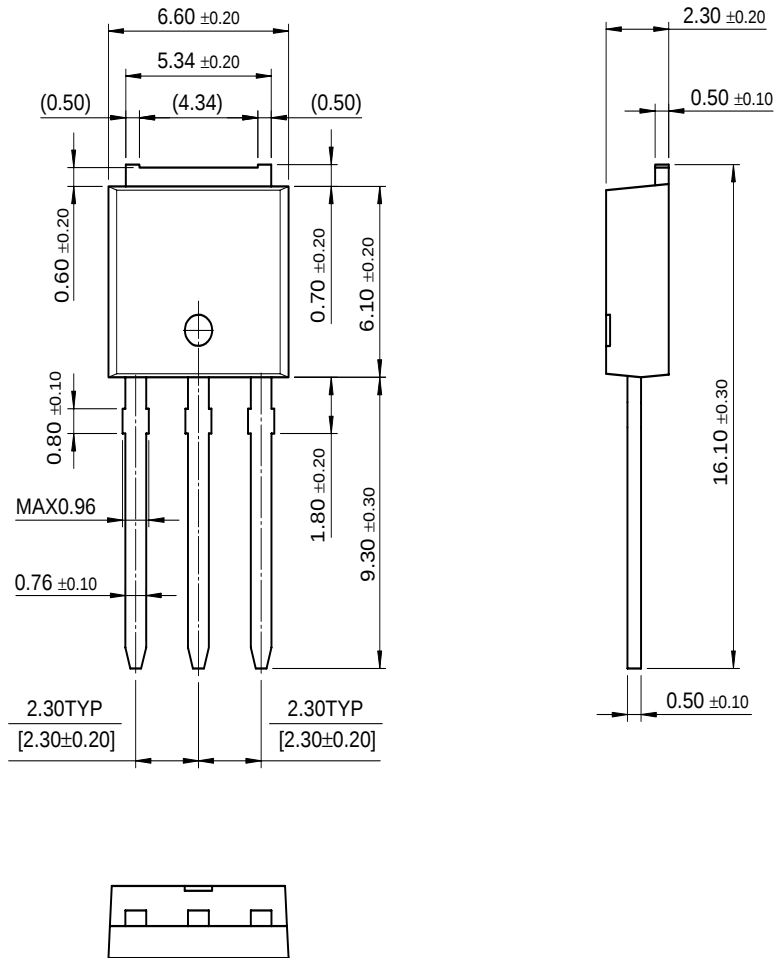
