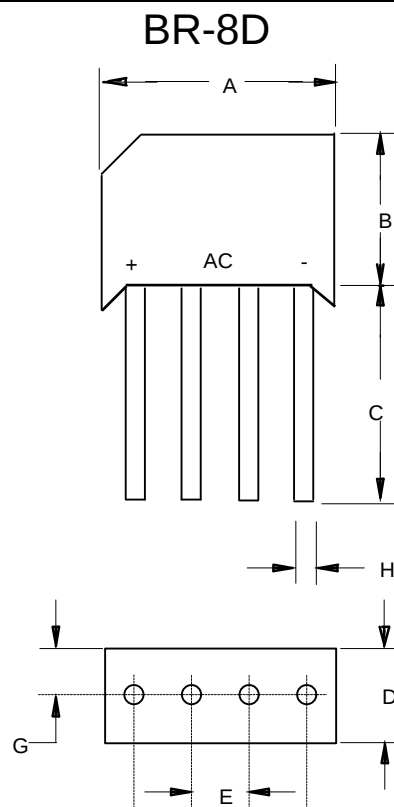

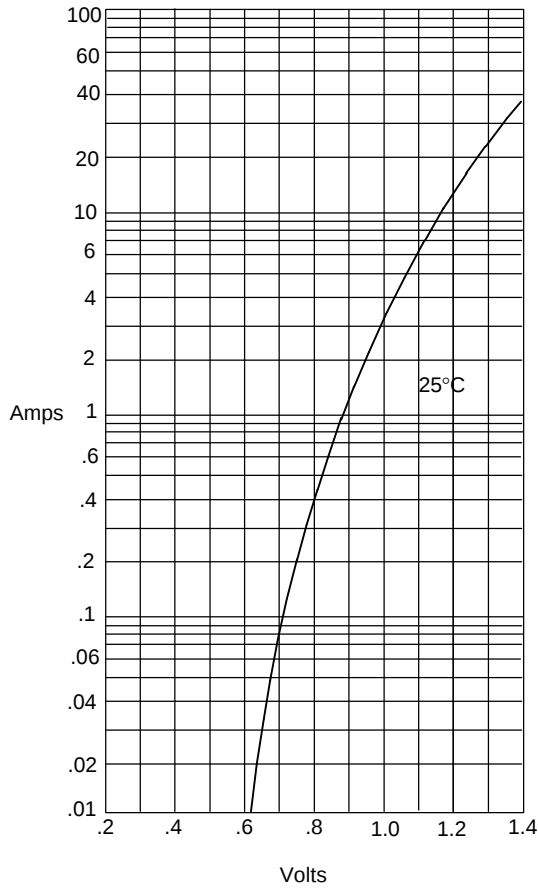

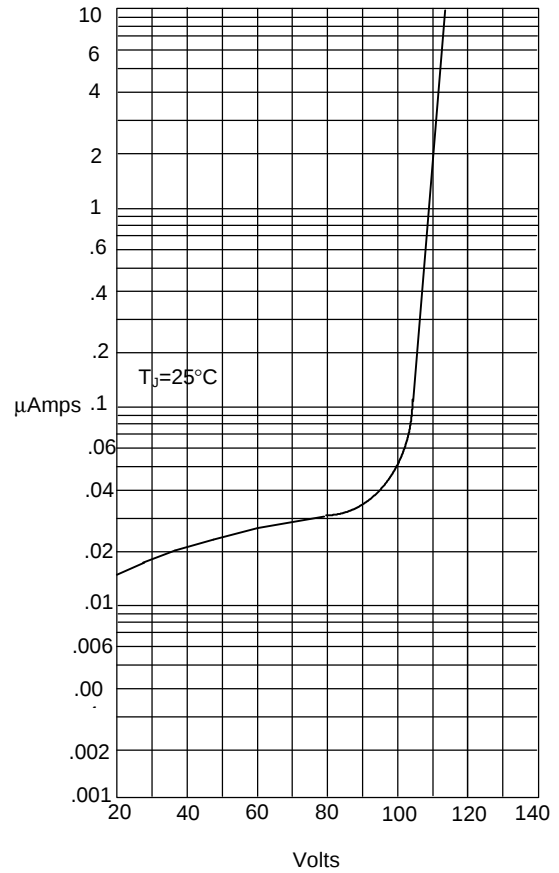

Typical Forward Characteristics



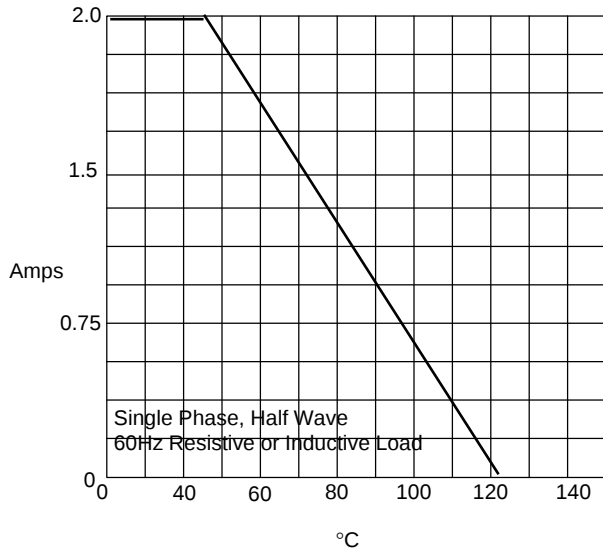
Instantaneous Forward Current - Amperes *versus*

Typical Reverse Characteristics



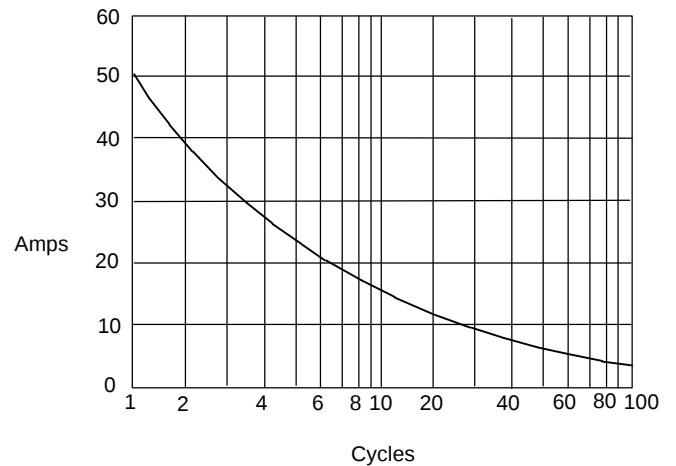
Instantaneous Reverse Leakage Current - MicroAmperes *versus*
